### DEFINITIONS

---

**KINGDOM** - The spiritual reign or authority of God. A kingdom, country, state, or territory ruled by a king or queen.

**WAR** - A state of armed conflict between different kingdom, nations, states or different groups within a nation, state and spiritual realm.

**ARMY** - An organized military force equipped for fighting on land. An **army** (from Latin arma "arms, weapons" via Old French armée, "armed" [feminine]), ground force or land force is a fighting force that fights

primarily on land. In the broadest sense, it is the land-based military branch, service branch or armed service of a nation or state.

**Command** – Give an authoritative order

**STANDARDS** - An idea or thing used as a measure, norm, or model in comparative evaluations.

**LAWS** - The system of rules which a particular kingdom, country or community recognizes as regulating the actions of its members and which it may enforce by the imposition of penalties.

**EXPECTATIONS** - A belief that someone will or should achieve something.

## ARMY STRUCTURE

---

**SOLDIER** – A person who serves in an army.

**BUDDY TEAM** - The Buddy Team consists of two individuals who are responsible for safeguarding, protecting and caring for one another's safety, health and welfare.

**2 + 2 QUAD TEAM** - Two pair of Buddy Teams together creating a small inner circle.

**SQUAD** - The squad is a soldier's most intimate group, consisting of four to twenty individuals per.

**PLATOON** - A subdivision of a company-sized military unit normally consisting of four squads up to a total of 60 individuals

**COMPANY** - A company is normally made up of three to six platoons, which means 160 to 240 soldiers, but it can have more.

**BATTALION** - Typically, a battalion consists of 3 to 5 companies or more could be up to 1200 soldiers.

**Brigade** - A brigade consists up to 3 to 5 Battalions, could be more and has up to 6000 or more soldier

**DIVISION** - A division usually consists of 18,000 soldiers and up. In most armies, a division is composed of several regiments or brigades.

**CORPS** - A unit of ground combat forces consisting of two or more divisions enlisting more than 36,000 soldiers.

**FIELD ARMY** - A **field army** composed of two or more corps and may be subordinate to an **army** group. A **field army** is composed of 50 thousand troops or more,
