SIGNS OF THE GATES OF HADES OPERATING IN ONE'S LIFE

when the **Gates of Hades are operating in the life of anyone**, the following signs are evident.

1. **Evil dreams**; every spiritual invasion begins in the dream world. Once your dream world is conquered, your life is doomed. Before anything manifests into the natural, it begins in the spiritual and the dream world for this matter, therefore, every demonic invasion begins in the dream world. Job 7:13-15 "When I think my bed will comfort me and my couch will ease my complaint, even then you frighten me with dreams and terrify me with visions, so that I prefer strangling and death, rather than this body of mine" NIV.
2. **Chronic diseases like COVID - 19**
3. **Lack of progress in life, always moving in circles - Cycles**
4. **Miscarriages** – No Longer able produce Fruit
5. **Premature deaths – Giving up the Vision - The Dream** – No longer seeing the Purpose of it

6. **Frequent accidents, always involving in accidents** – A Stumble Block – hindering others
7. **Abject poverty** – Destitute – Extremely Poor
8. **Vagabond – Not Settled** – Homeless - Wander

PHYSICAL - THE GATES OF JERUSALEM

The Zion Gate: Bearing Jerusalem's earliest biblical name in Hebrew and English, this gate's Arabic name is the Gate of the Prophet David, as the Tomb of King David, on adjacent Mount Zion, is only a few steps away. Zion Gate leads directly to the Armenian and Jewish quarters.

The Dung Gate: This gate's unusual name derives from the refuse dumped here in antiquity, where the prevailing winds would carry odors away. Nehemiah 2:13 mentions a Dung Gate that was probably near this one. This gate leads directly to the Western Wall and the Southern Wall Archaeological Park.

Gate of Mercy: This gate, in the eastern Temple-Mount wall, may be the best-known of them all. Also called the Golden Gate or the Eastern Gate, it has been blocked for centuries, and is said to be awaiting a miraculous opening when the Messiah comes and the dead are resurrected.

Lions Gate: This portal is named after a pair of ferocious-looking animal carvings that flank it. They are actually tigers, the heraldic symbol of the 13th-century Sultan Beybars. It is also called St. Stephen's Gate, after the first Christian martyr, who tradition says was stoned nearby. Lions Gate, which leads to the Pools of Bethesda, the Via Dolorosa, and the markets, became famous during the Six Day War.

Herod's Gate: Despite its name, the notorious Judean king had nothing to do with this gate. In Arabic and Hebrew this north-facing gate, which leads to the Old City markets, is called the Flowers Gate. Some say the name derives from a rosette carved over it. However, in Arabic a similar word means "awakened," and may refer to a nearby cemetery and the hope of resurrection.

Damascus Gate: This most imposing of Jerusalem's gateways also faces north and is named for the grand city from which Jerusalem's rulers once came. It is always a busy thoroughfare, thanks to the bustling markets within. Below the 16th-century gate, archaeologists have uncovered part of the entryway built by Emperor Hadrian in the second century CE.

The New Gate: This is the only Old City entryway not part of the original design of the 16th-century walls. It was breached in the waning days of the Ottoman Empire to allow Christian pilgrims quicker access to their holy places within the ramparts.

The Jaffa Gate: This was the destination of Jewish and Christian pilgrims disembarking at the Jaffa port, hence its name. It led (and still leads) directly to the Jewish and Christian quarters, as well as to the most popular parts of the market, and to the Tower of David Museum, once Jerusalem's citadel and now a showcase of its history.

PSALM 63 – ISAIAH 59:16-17

What is intercession? It is sacrificial prayer. It focuses less on you and more on others. It asks for God's power to be unleashed in the world. It is the act of interceding (intervening or mediating) between two parties. In Christian religious usage, it is a prayer to God on behalf of others.

Intercessory prayer involves spiritual warfare. Our battle is not against flesh and blood, and it is not fought with carnal weapons. We win these battles on our knees:

Interceding to plead or make a request in behalf of another or others: to intercede with the authorities for the prisoner; to intervene for the purpose of producing agreement...

An Intercessor is a person who by calling or by nature chooses to be a mediator on behalf of those who cannot intervene for themselves. Intercessors make requests, urge, plead, beg, counsel, discuss, risk, sacrifice, and make war on issues relating to the weaker ones, and thus they have an impact on the final outcomes for those they serve.

There is a difference between a person who is called an intercessor and a person who prays. Any person can pray, but not all praying people are intercessors. The opposite is true also - an intercessor may live his entire life and live to make only one great act of intercession. The differences of an intercessor are subtle - hidden in the life and heart behind the prayer. There are many examples of intercessors in the Bible, and they walked with the favor to impact and change God's heart. Consider the following role models and their characteristics.

Travailing and Groaning

to utter a deep, mournful sound expressive of pain or grief.

to make a deep, inarticulate sound expressive of derision, disapproval, desire, etc.

to make a sound resembling a groan; resound harshly:

verb (used with object)

to utter or express with groans.

“In the same way, the Spirit also helps our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we should, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for us with groaning's too deep for words; and He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.” **Romans 8:26-27**

There are times when one gets desperate for God and for His intervention. There are also times when the Lord will cause one to become heavily burdened for what He is burdened about. We could call it the burden of the Lord. Jesus demonstrated this, “And being in agony He was praying very fervently; and His sweat became like drops of blood, falling upon the ground.” Luke 22:44.

A travail prayer is the suffering of Christ in prayer. Romans explain it quite well. Paul writes, "That I have great sorrow and unceasing grief in my heart." Romans 9:2

DEEP to Great Dimensions in Prayer – Ephesians 3

Dimensions means

a measurable extent of some kind, such as length, breadth, depth, or height.

an aspect or feature of a situation, problem, or thing.

1. form or shape (something) to particular measurements.

Wailing – crying with pain, grief, or anger. – Like A Toddler

- **making a prolonged high-pitched sound. Like a Siren**
- **(2 Corinthians 10:3-5)**
Through intercessory prayer, you can subdue the forces of hell and render Satan powerless, because "the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds!"
